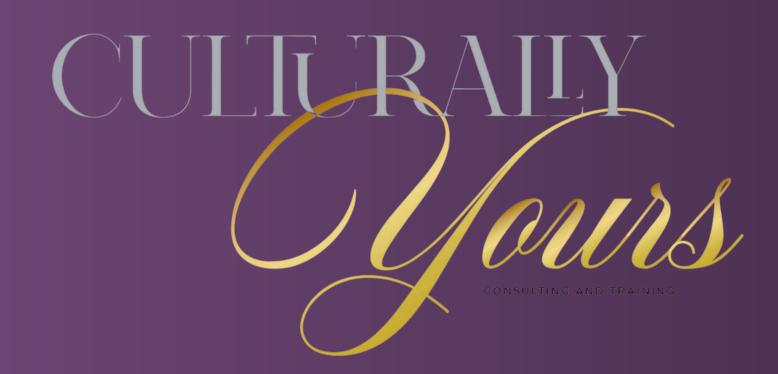

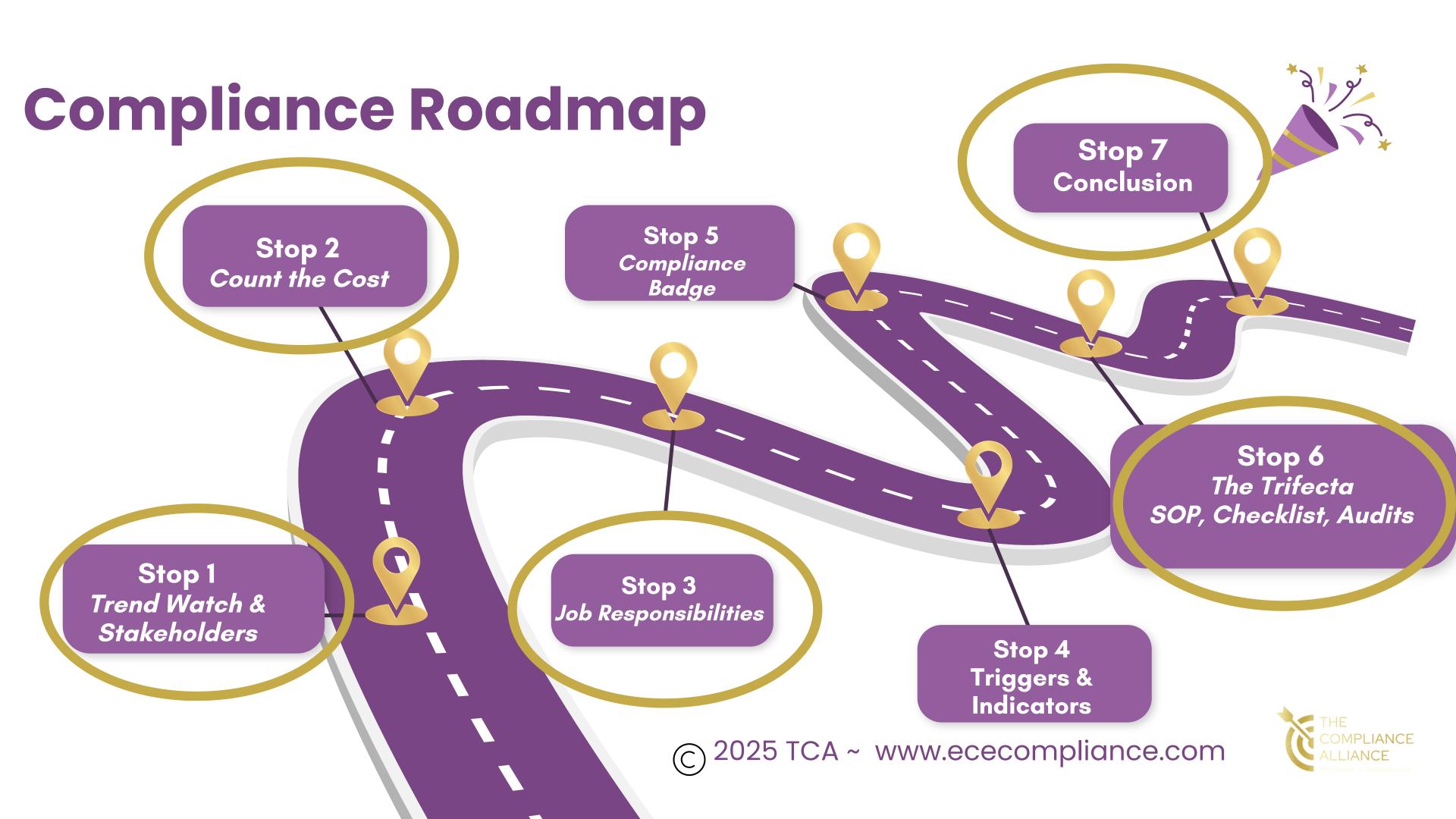

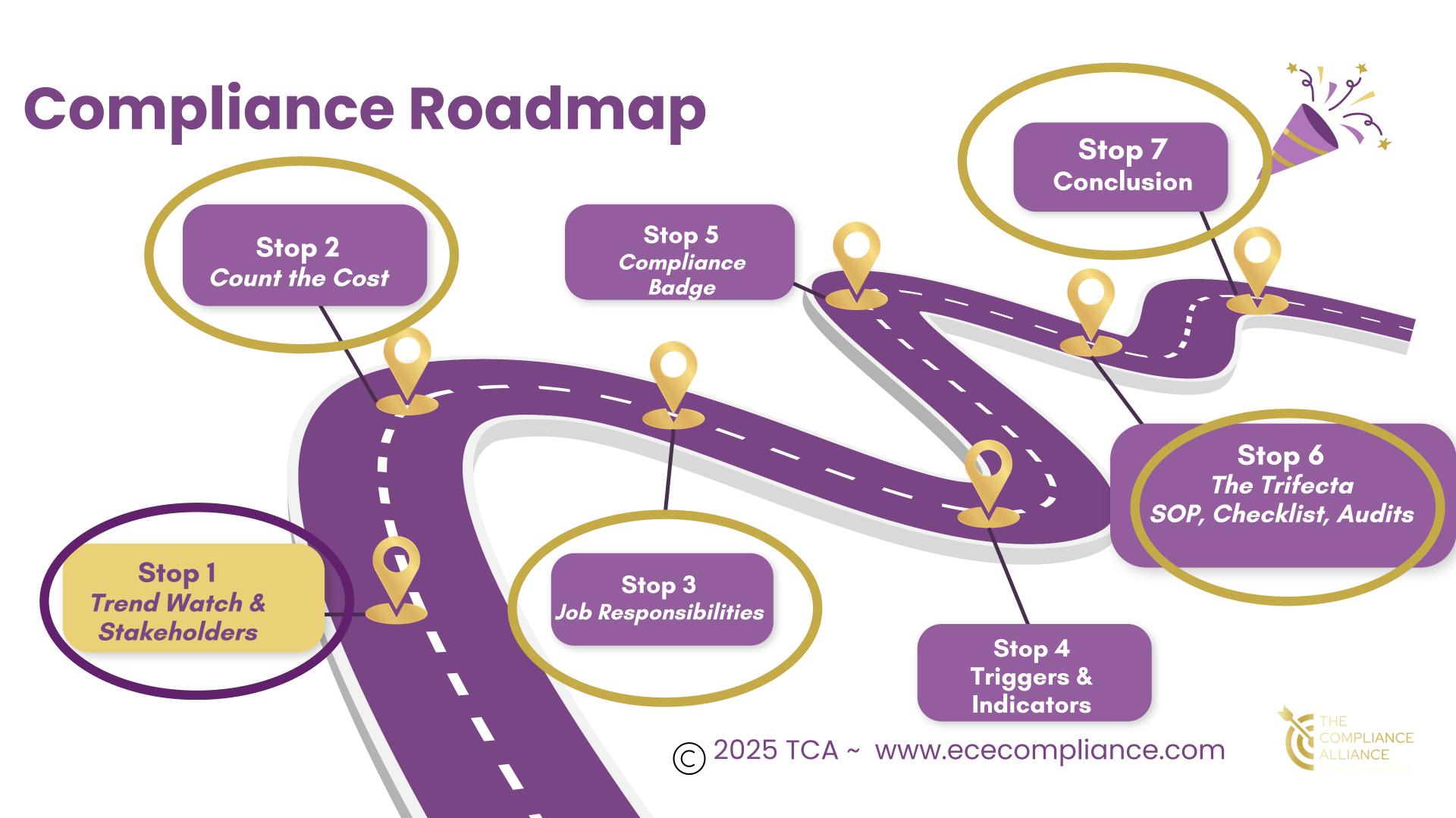


### Compliance Preparedness

- B Honestly... it feels intimidating or unclear; unsure how to implement compliance practices

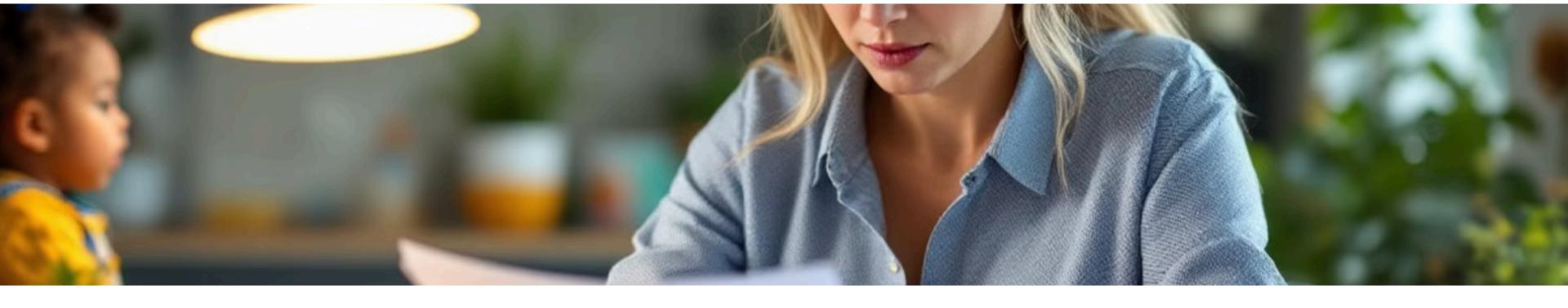

Your best defense is a well established history of safety, audits, and proactive corrective measures "Control the Narrative"





### Investor Risk Due Dilligence

Infusion of Cash or Your Future Exit Strategy or Your Expansion Acquisition

Due Dilligence = Licensing Review & Risk Assessment - what is my risk?

- Analyze licensing visit history
- Evaluate corrective actions and compliance trajectory
- Classify citations and risk severity
- Assess if citations are a people issue or process issue

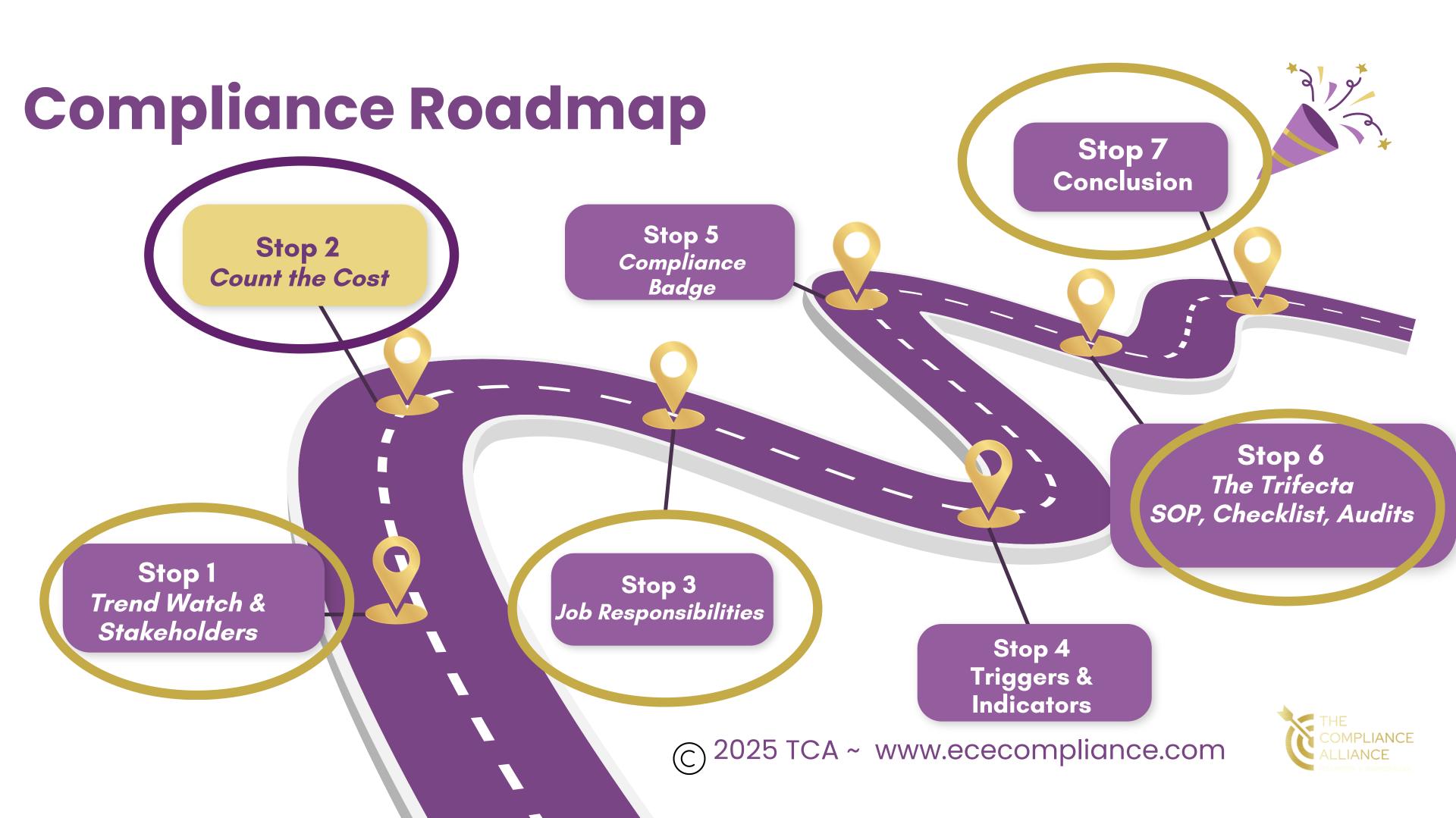

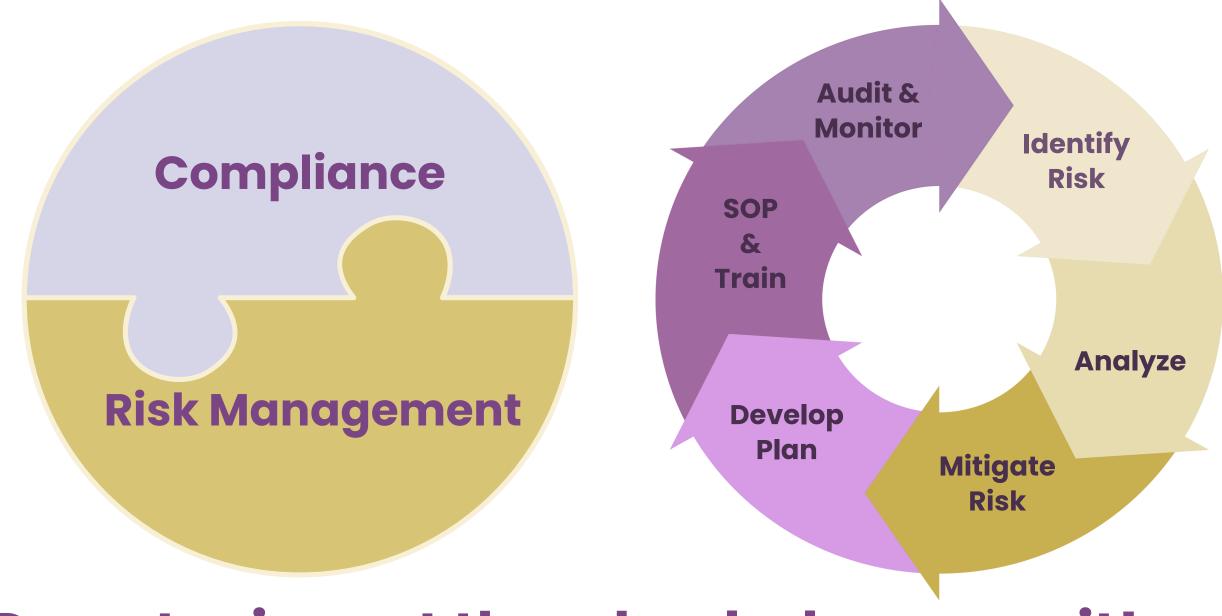

### Keeping it Simple - Risk Management



#### Key Variables - Identify and Evaluate Known Risks

- Severity: how serious could the risk be?
- People Impact: what is the potential harm? (children, staff)
- Rank: what is the relative risk (H, M, L)
- Probability: how likely is it to occur?
- Financial Impact: what are the financial costs

- Abuse/Molestation Male employee had improper contact with several children - \$2,874,978
- Child slid down slide with rope around his neck, rope got caught and choked him - \$1,504,572
- Mother of a child attending party slipped & Fell on bubbles from bubble maker - \$863,447
- 8 month old infant found unresponsive while taking a nap, pronounced dead at the hospital -\$846,157

- 10 month old child was burned when he reached and pulled a bottle warmer on himself - \$575,000
- Child was suffocated under a bean bag while playing hide and seek - \$515,000
- Employee handled 2 year old roughly, hit the child, and force feeding -\$121,969
- Staff was changing child's diaper on changing table, turned to get powder, and the child rolled off, broken arm -\$109,687
- Child Fell from the playground slide and broke her eye socket - \$102,382

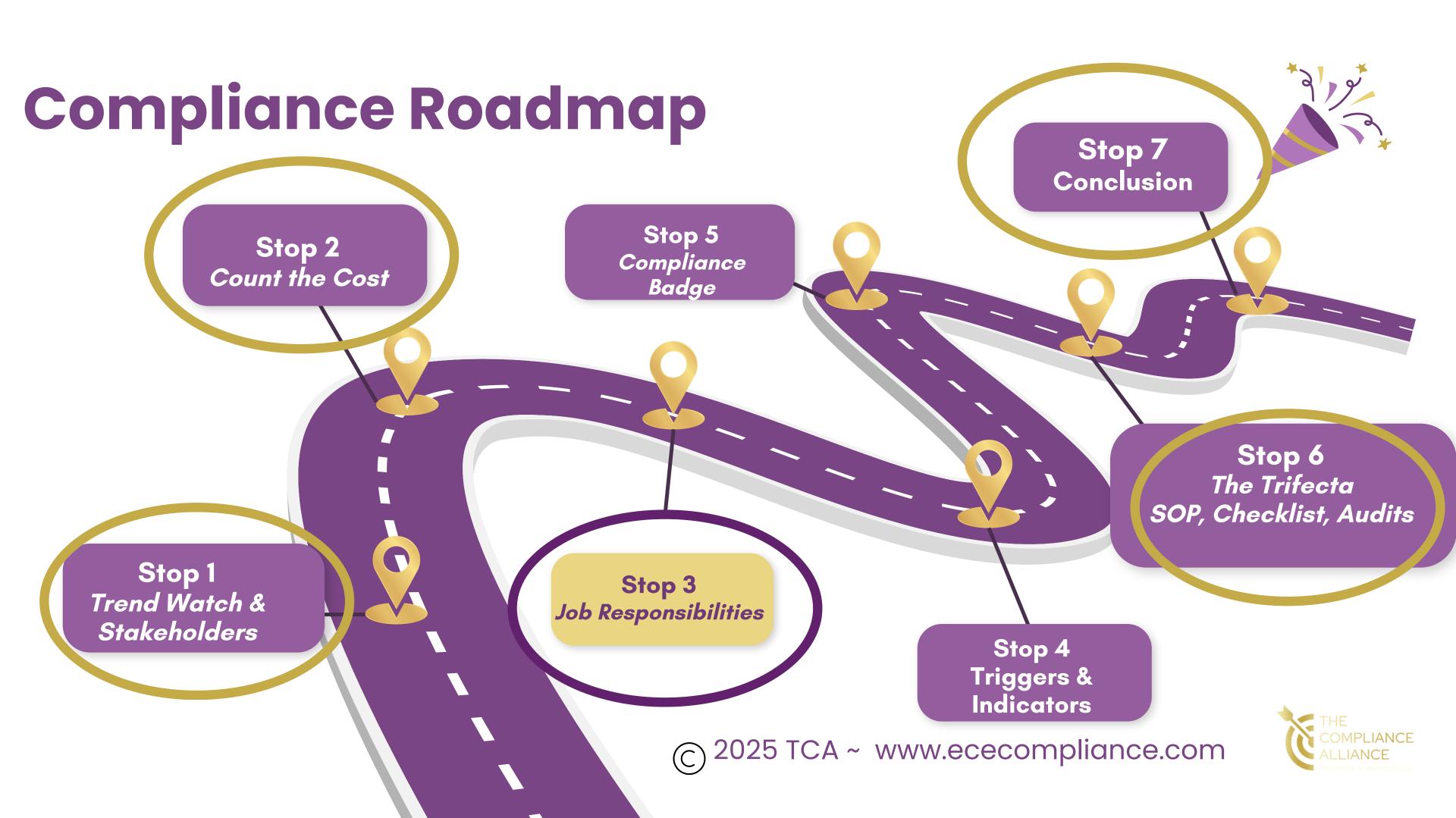

#### SOP & Systems

#### Operating Procedures Development:

Develop, implement, and update standard operating procedures to ensure compliance with federal, state, and local regulations governing early childhood education.

#### Budget Management:

Manage the budget for compliance-related activities, including training, audits, tools, dashboards, and any necessary upgrades or improvements to facilities and programs.

#### Regulatory Compliance Oversight:

Monitor and ensure compliance with federal, state, and local regulations governing early childhood education, including licensing requirements, health and safety standards, quality and educational guidelines.

#### Train & Educate

#### Continuous Improvement:

Conduct training sessions and workshops to educate staff on compliance requirements, best practices, and protocols for maintaining a safe and nurturing environment for children.

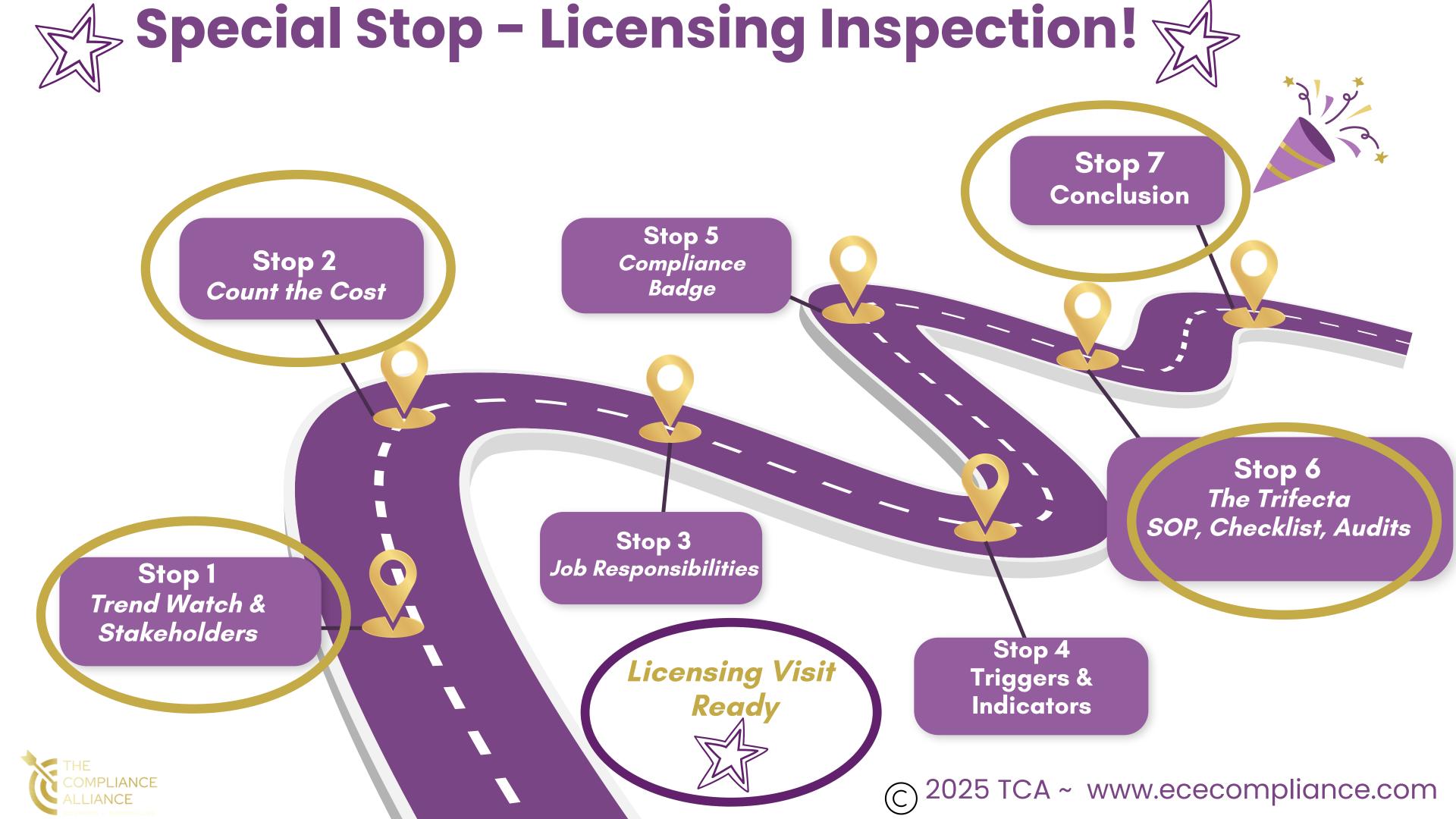
#### Quality Assurance and Improvement:

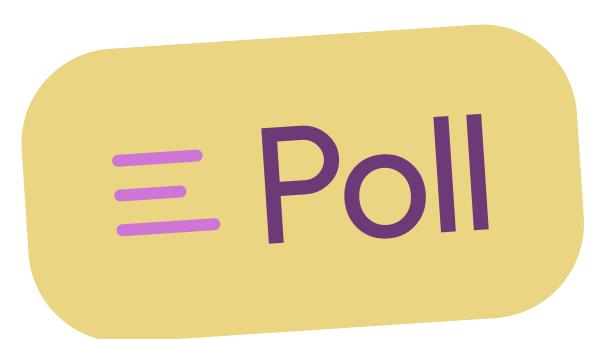
Establish quality assurance processes to assess program effectiveness, identify areas for improvement, and implement corrective actions.

#### Risk Management:

Identify potential risks and hazards within the early childhood education environment and develop strategies to mitigate them effectively.







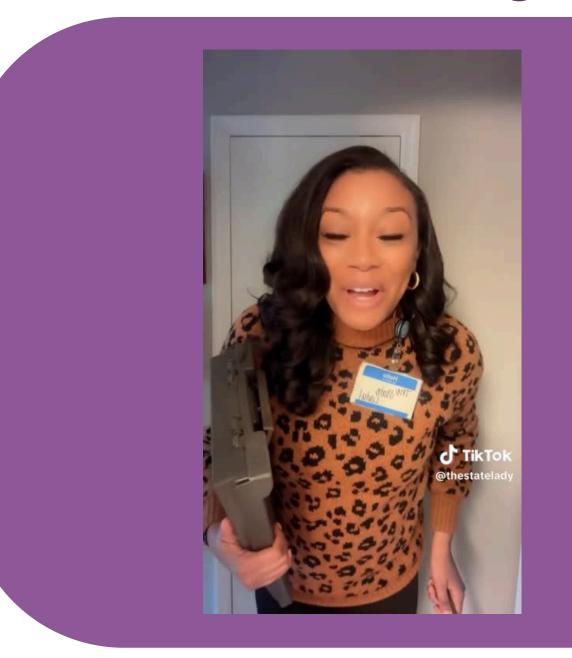

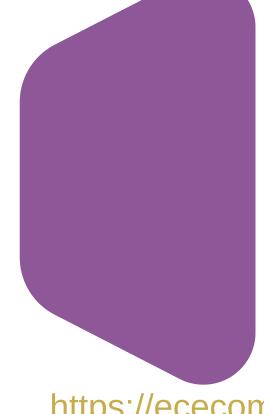

### **Building Confidence BEFORE Your Licensing Inspection**

### Mock State Inspection ~ Walk Throughs

- A walk-through of your facility that mirrors/mimics a state inspection
- Identifies possible violations/deficiencies/ issues BEFORE licensing arrives
  - Also is aware/identifies past issues
  - Helps staff prepare for inspection day
  - Reduces Stress







### Completing Mock State Inspections

#### Who should do them?

- Owner/ Director/ A Hired Consultant
  - requires someone knowledgable of the rules
- Designated Staff
  - Compliance/ Health and Safety Coordinator
- Shadowing
- Rotating Staff

<u>Unbiased</u> review of classrooms and facility

State Compliance affects Work Place CULTURE, compliance is a TEAM effort, NOT a solo project.

# Facility Walk ThroughInside

- Search for hazards
  - Hazards, Unlocked Cabinet
- Ratios
- Various times of the day

# Facility Walk ThroughOutside

- Search for rule violations
  - Hazard,
     broken
     equipment,
     biting
     stinging
     insects
     Ratios

#### **Review of Files**

- Staff Records
  - Training
- Children
   Records
  - Only Required forms/doc
- Transportation/
   Field Trip Forms

#### **Follow Up**

- Review of items previously cited
- Revisit training as needed







### **Conducting The Mock Inspection**

- Should be done Regularly
  - Monthly/Bi Monthly
    - Varies based on size of program and
    - Violations found
- Unannounced to Staff
- Document occurrences









### What to look for during a Mock Inspection



**Health and Safety** 

Are staff using safe practices?
Handwashing, diaper changing
procedures, is the classroom
"clean"?



**Accessible Hazards** 

Are materials age appropriate? In good repair?



**Supervision/ Ratios** 

Are staff watching children? How many children are present with staff? Are there any barriers prohibiting staffs ability to see children?







### Supervison vs Ratios

### Supervision

- active, intentional, and ongoing observation of children by staff
- requires being close enough to see, hear, and respond to children's needs immediately.

### Ratios

 required number of adults supervising a specific number of children, as determined by licensing rules.



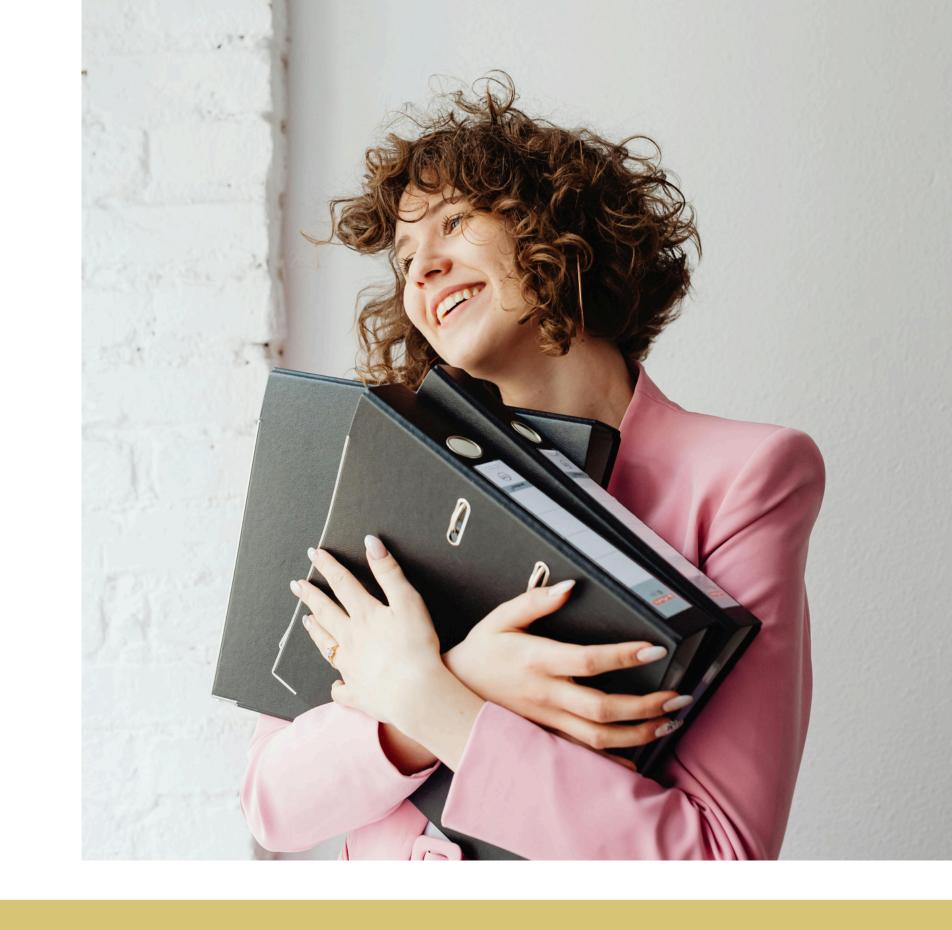




### What to look for Continued...

#### Staff and Children's File

- Files should be complete at enrollment
  - No blanks
  - Reviewed regularly while enrolled
- Reviewed by someone who did not complete them
- Organized for review









### What to look for Continued...

### Transportation/ Field Trip Documentation

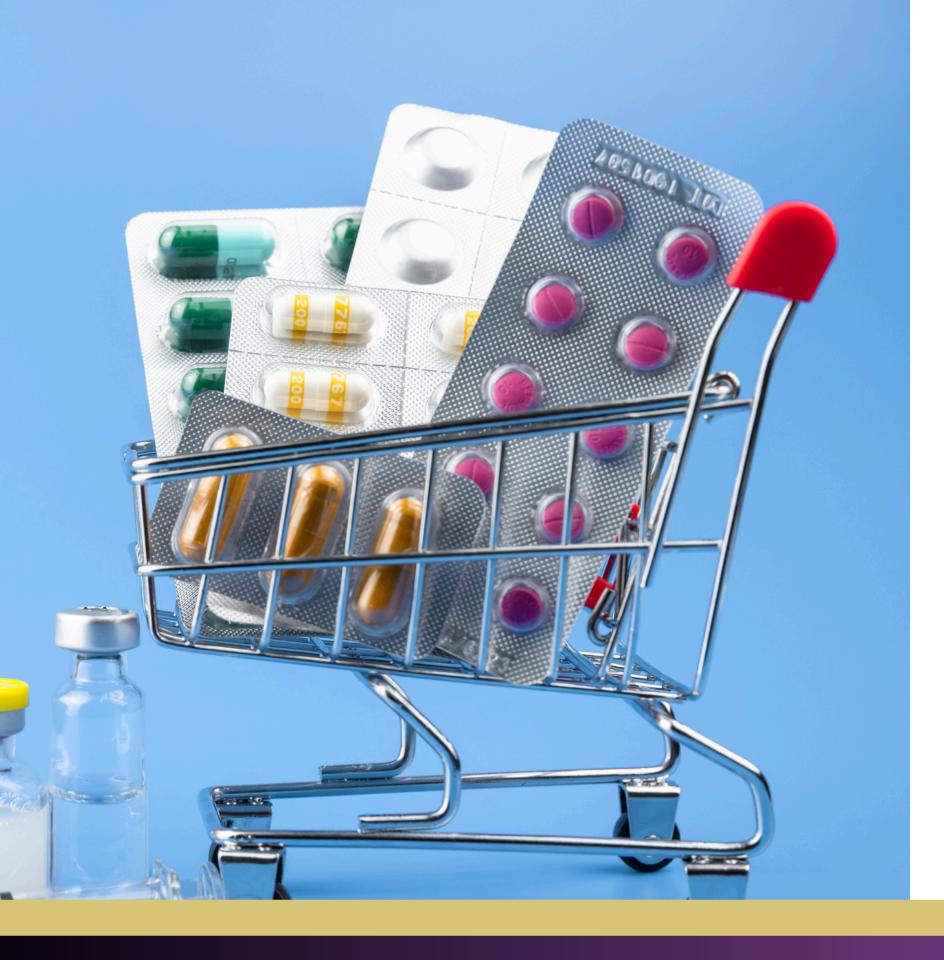
- Files should be complete prior to transporting
  - No blanks
  - Reviewed regularly while enrolled
- Ensure Vehicle is checked
  - Ensure restraints are in good repair
  - Ensure NO CHILD is left behind











### **Medication Forms**

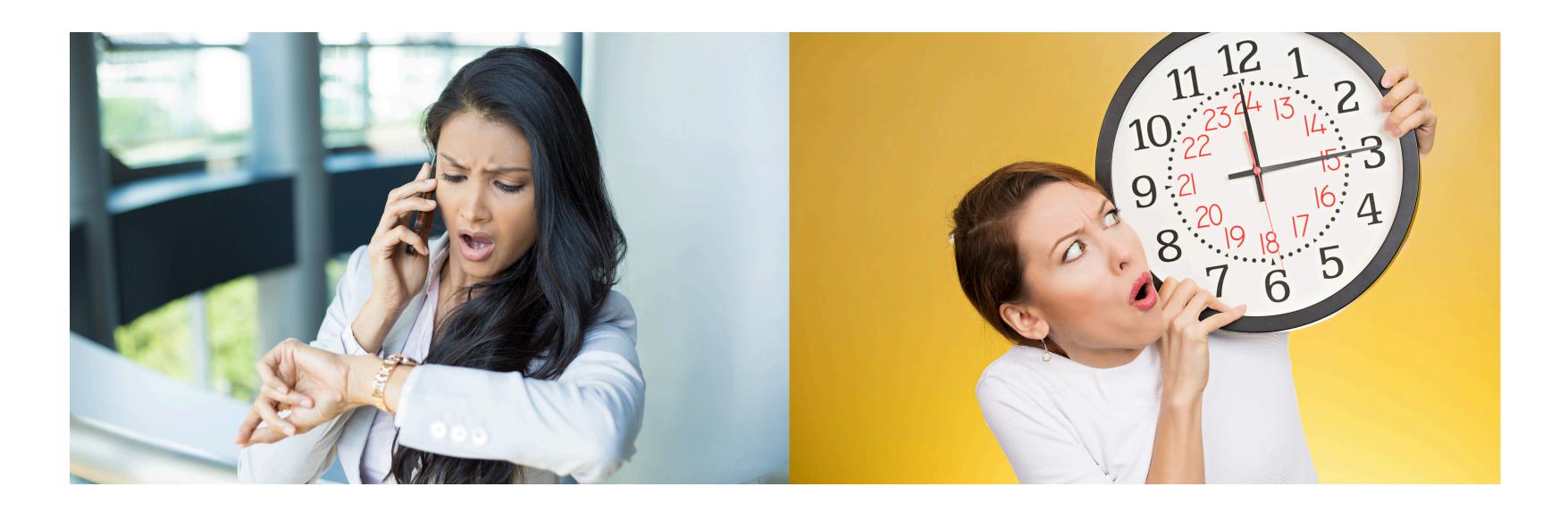
- Ensure you have authorization to dispense
- Ensure medication is stored in a locked cabinet/inaccessible
- Ensure medication is labeled
  - Ensure medication is not expired
  - Age appropriate for child

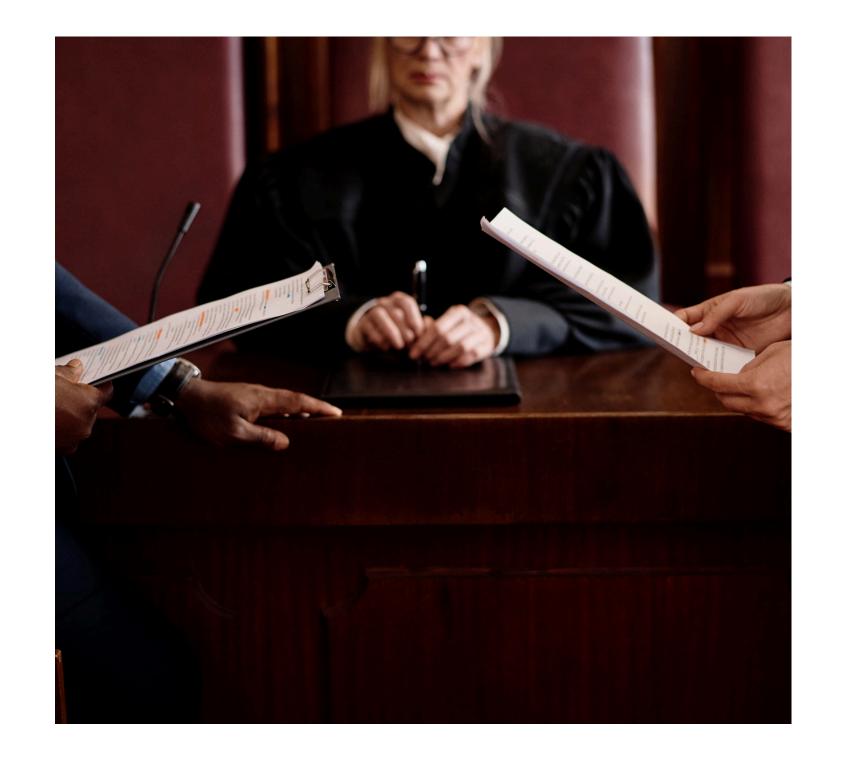

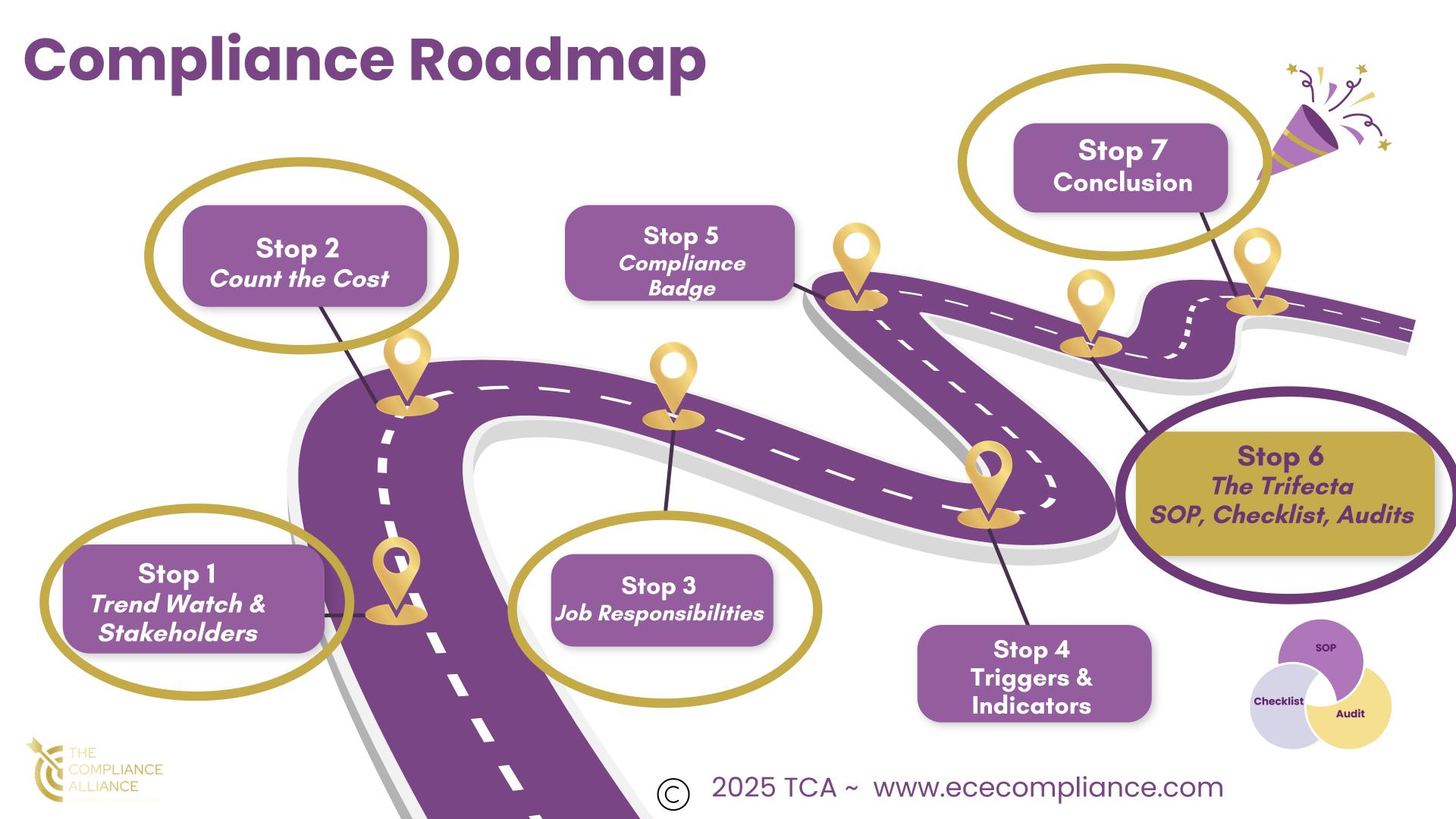












## Mock Licensing Visit vs Compliance Risk Audit

#### **Mock Licensing Visit**

#### **Purpose:**

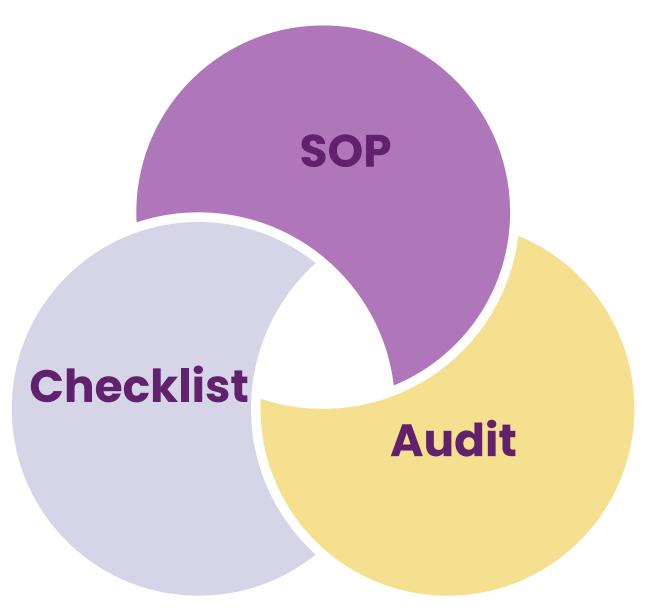
A Mock Licensing Visit simulates a real state licensing inspection. The goal is to prepare programs for actual licensing visits by identifying immediate compliance issues and ensuring readiness for announced and unnounced visits.

#### **Compliance Risk Audit**

#### **Purpose:**

A Compliance Audit is a strategic review of operational systems, standard operating procedures and overall program risks. The goal is to evaluate compliance and risk exposure. Each audit generates a risk score with action items.

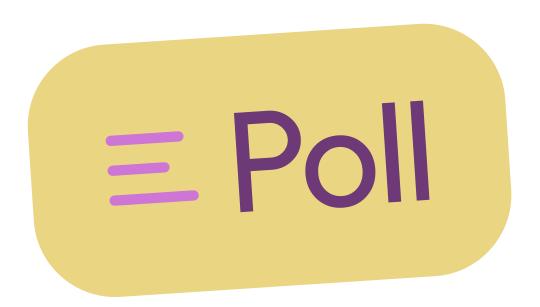

Proper supervision also facilitates smooth transitions and fosters a safe and enjoyable environment for children.

#### As Appropriate - Add

• Are SOPs documented and up-to-date?

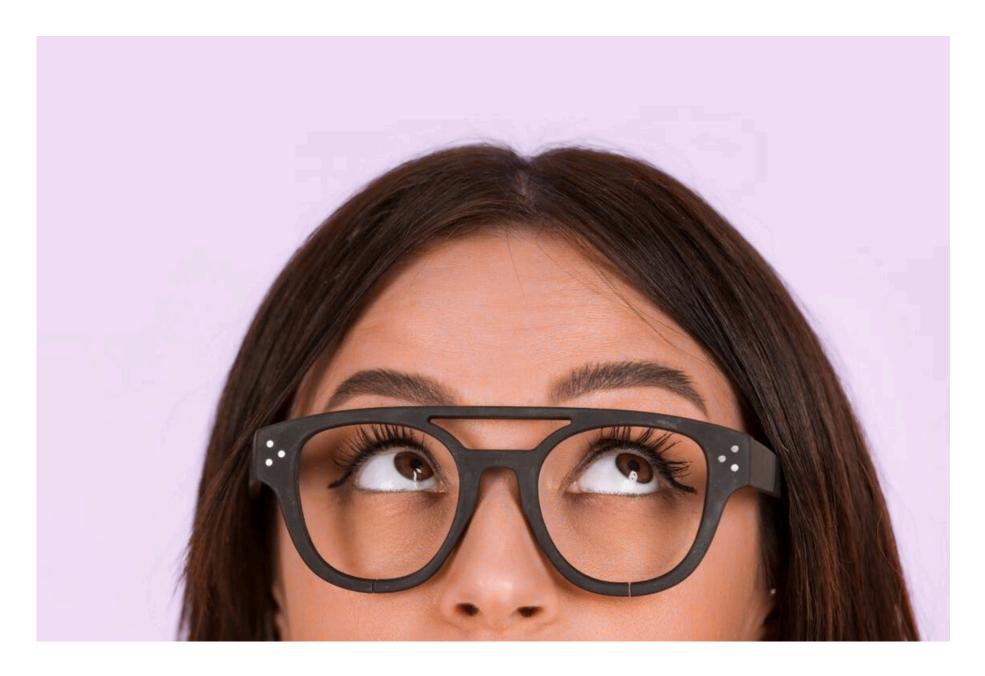


- Are both initial and refresher SOP training provided to all staff? Documented training?

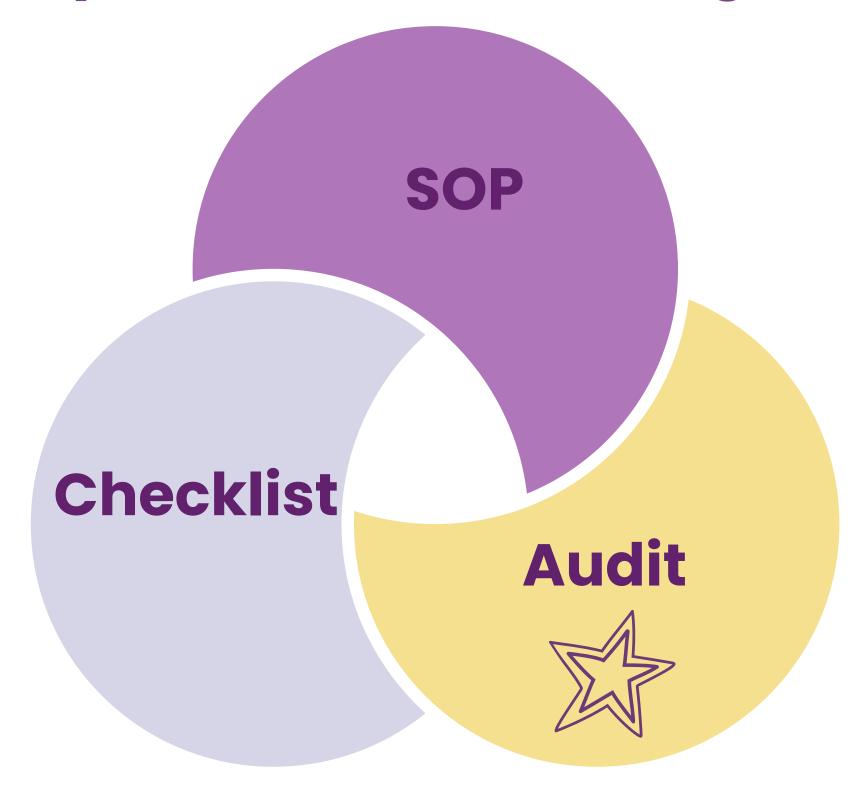


### Components of a Solid Checklist



- Documented with purpose
- Goes beyond Yes or No
- Tied to SOP
- Incorporates weighted values
- Trust and Verify "inspect what you expect"
- Promote a culture of continuous improvement

- Evaluates practices, procedures, and records
- Measures alignment with standards & policies
- Identifies risks, corrective action plans
- Strengthens consistency & accountability



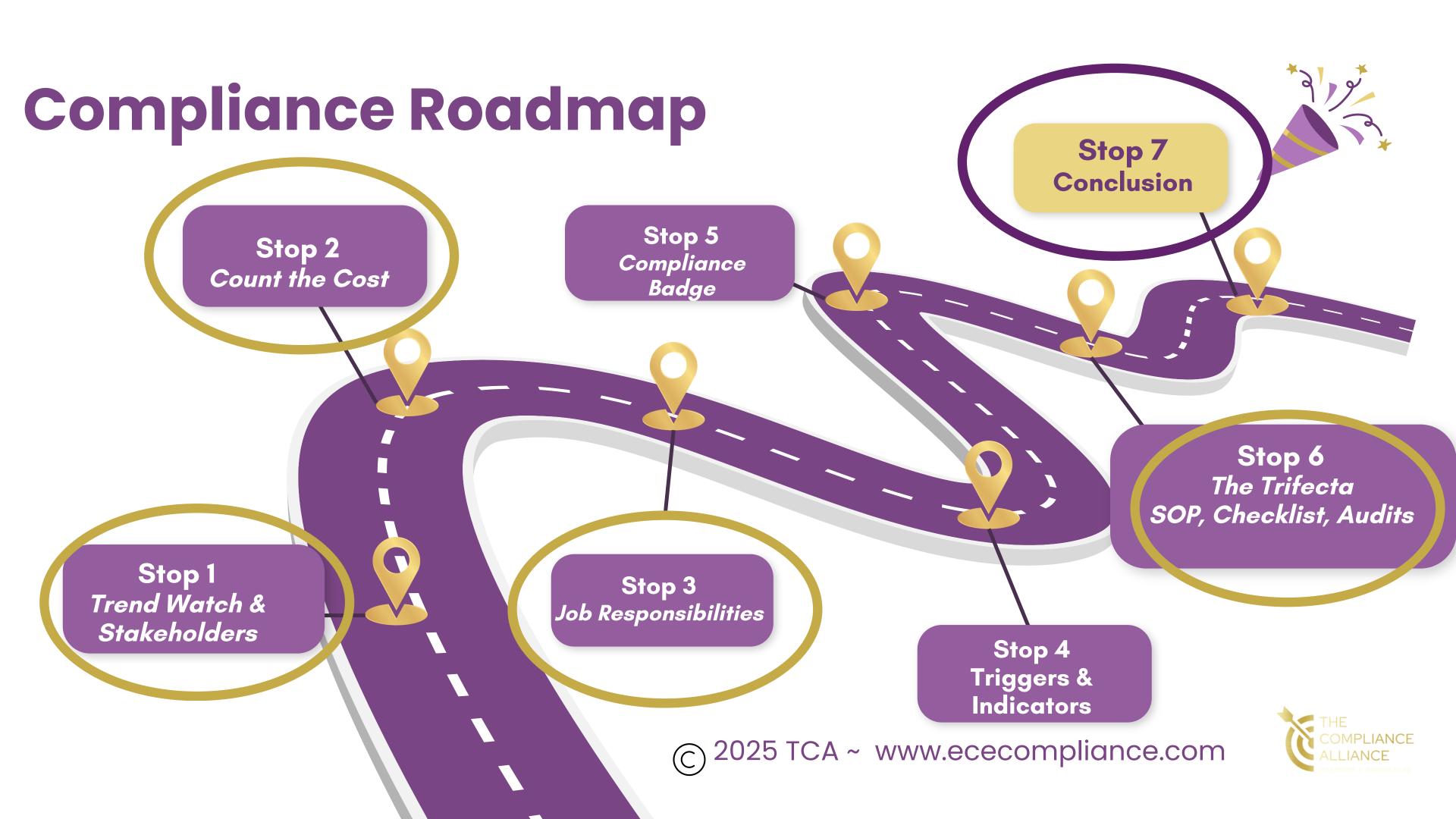
