



	Ask Yourself:	Yes	No
1.	Have you determined the primary reasons you want to pursue a third party quality endorsement?		
1.	Do you have specific outcomes in mind?		
1.	Do you believe your staff and families will support and contribute to the effort?		
1.	Are you willing to honestly assess your program and make necessary changes?		
1.	Are you able to commit financially and time-wise?		
1.	Is the turnover rate relatively stable, both of the management and the staff?		
1.	Is the family satisfaction rate consistently high?		
1.	Does your program have defined policies and procedures?		
1.	Does the program have an educational philosophy and offer learning opportunities in all domains of early childhood development?		
1.	Is a high level of health & safety a priority?		
1.	Is the program in good standing with licensing?

Consider it essential rather than extra

2. Determine who has the highest level and go for it!

3. Create a chart of mandatory and optional trainings for all systems to track.

4. Immediately create for a PDP for each staff member and use it!

- 1. Evaluate your own attitude toward change.
- 2. Create a shared vision a visual map.
- 3. Understand everyone's response to change and use it for your benefit.





- 1. Develop a communication hub and keep it updated.
- 2. Understand how each person communicates most effectively.
- 3. Communicate with the three Cs: Clear, Concise, and Complete



- 1. Learn about goal setting.
- 2. Align actions with goals.
- 3. Personalize and internalize.
- 4. Write measurable goals and measure them.

Goal Setting


- 1. Understand the difference between an adult learner and a child learner.

Is this a quality improvement task? If so, what do I need to put in place to ensure its long-term survival?




