SAMPLE QUESTIONS

QUESTIONS TO BUILD ENGAGEMENT WITH PARENTS

- What three words would you use to describe your child?
- What does your child love? What interests or excites them?
- What are your hopes and dreams for your child this year?
- What do you see as your child's strengths?
- What skills is your child working on?
- What are your favorite things to do with your child?

APPRECIATIVE INQUIRY QUESTIONS FOR CHALLENGING SITUATIONS

- What is working well for you as a parent despite the current challenge we are facing?
- In what ways can we work together to improve this situation?
- How do you handle this (specific challenge or behavior) at home? What works best? What does not work well?
- What do you see as a positive outcome of this situation?
- How can working through this challenge benefit your child?
- What is the one thing you would like me to fully understand about this situation?
- What skills is your child working on?
- What are your favorite things to do with your child?

KEY QUESTIONS

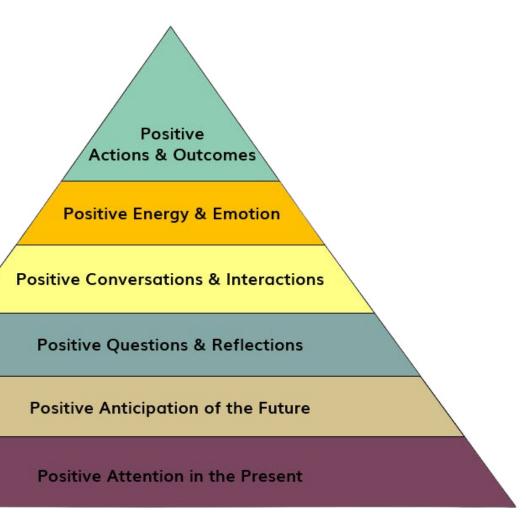
- What would it be like to be curious about who you're with rather than judging or fearing them?
- What would it be like to engage together, exploring possibilities rather than withdrawing in conflict or disagreement?
- What would it be like to be working well together?

HELPFUL QUESTIONS FOR UNHELPFUL THOUGHTS

- Is this thought in any way helpful or useful?
- Is this thought an old story? Have I heard it before?
- What do I get for buying into this story (thought)?
- Does this thought help me take effective action?

ACTIVITIES TO STRENGTHEN CONNECTIONS WITH FAMILIES

ASK PARENTS TO SHARE THEIR HOPES AND DREAMS

This easy-to-implement activity guides you in learning about each parent's hopes and dreams for their child. You can ask parents to share their hopes and dreams at an in-person meeting or by sending a form home to each family. Create a master list of all of the hopes and dreams, and use them as inspiration to build strong connections with families. Consider creating a wall display with keywords from all the responses to hopes and dreams. You can also weave the messages from the hopes and dreams statements into newsletters and future parent events. Find ways to show parents that you honor their thoughts and strive to bring their desires to life in the program.

CREATE A SUCCESS BOARD TO HIGHLIGHT POSITIVE EXPERIENCES

Invite parents to share special moments they have experienced at a parent event or provide individual opportunities for sharing. Encourage them to think about everyday moments of joy, wonder, and connection. Consider asking parents to share their thoughts by sending them a letter and asking them to fill in slips of paper or send their thoughts to you electronically. Adding the parents' thoughts and ideas to your success board will help everyone see how their work matters!

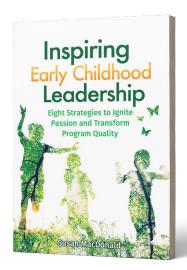

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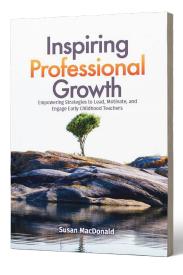
