
#### **Election Day: What's at Stake?**







#### The Biden/Harris Record

- Build Back Better Act (2021)
  - Proposed a \$390 billion investment in child care and pre-K
  - Limits child care costs to 7% of family income for families earning up to 250% of the state median income, universal pre-K
- President Biden's FY25 budget proposal
  - Cap child care spending at \$10/day for lower income families

American Rescue Plan (2021)	
<ul> <li>Included \$39 billion in dedicated child care relief funding</li> </ul>	
April 2023 Executive Order	
- February 2024 rule: limits amount CCDF families can pay to 7%	
<ul> <li>February 2024 rule: limits amount CCDF families can pay to 7% of their household income, makes it easier to eliminate copayments for poorest families</li> </ul>

The Trump Record	
Expanded the child tax credit from \$1,000 to \$2,000 as part of the 2017 tax cut package	
2017: proposed a \$95 million cut to the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) program	
<ul> <li>Eventually signed legislation that raised CCDBG spending by \$2.37 billion, a historic increase</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>No details about child care plan, but claims that expanded tariffs will help pay for it</li> </ul>	
Vance: suggested that relatives help care for children
